Baptism: Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism. These classes will take place at the Rectory, by appointment only. To register for Pre-Jordan, please call the Rectory. Baptisms may be held any Sunday—once Pre-Jordan is completed.

Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation: Anyone who is asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.

Matrimony: Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

In today's Gospel Jesus calls us to view life from God's perspective rather than our own. It means getting out of ourselves and doing things God's way. It means changing. That's the "cost" of salvation. We hear Jesus say that those originally invited to the feast, those who appeared to be respectful and righteous insiders, were so preoccupied with their own affairs and agendas that they ignored the invitation. Jesus invites us to eternal life. Jesus' offer of salvation is a gift. Unfortunately, not everyone has or will accept this gift. As Catholics, coming to the altar to be in the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ is a weekly invitation to the Lord's feast, yet, too often we refuse the invitation. Once the invitation has been accepted, there has to be an appropriate response. Being a Christian is about responding like a Christian, putting the teachings of the Gospel into practice. It is not enough simply to be invited to the banquet of the church; we must also appropriately choose to respond to God's invitation. There is a banquet far beyond our imagining for those who do respond appropriately to God's invitation. God's invitation to salvation is free but not cheap. And it demands a response. Like the king in the parable in today's Gospel, our God requires a fitting response (a proper wedding garment) to His invitation to eternal life. How will we R.S.V.P. to Jesus' invitation?

Be assured of my prayers and I ask you to please pray for me.

OPENING OF 2021 MASS BOOK
Location: Church Vestibule

On Tuesday, October 20, 2020, the Mass Intention Book will open.

- Anyone who wants to have a Mass Intention said for their loved ones is asked to come to the Church Vestibule, **between 8:30 A.M. and 10:00 A.M.**, and you will be given a number.
- When your number is called you will proceed to **Station #1** where you will be able to request the date(s) for your Mass Intentions.

Please note, at this time there is a limit of 2 Sunday and 3 weekday Masses. However, beginning Monday October 26, 2020, you may request at the Rectory, between 9:30 A.M. and 4:00 A.M., as many Mass Intentions you wish, provided they are available.

- When you request your dates, you will be given the Mass Intention envelope(s) for the date(s) you requested. Then you proceed to **station #2**.
- **Station #2** will be tables and chairs where you may sit and write/print out on the intention envelope the name(s) of the Mass Intentions. Once you are finished you will then proceed to **station #3**.
- **Station #3** is where you will turn in your intention with the stipend. Also, at this point if you want to donate the bread and wine (\$25.00) and/or sanctuary lamp (\$20.00) in someone's memory, you may do so at this station.
