**Bible Study:** Bible Study is held in the classroom in the Church Vestibule every Saturday after the 8:00am Mass. (**Please note:** No Bible Study on Sodality Meeting Saturdays, and July and August.)

**Baptism:** Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism. These classes will take place at the Rectory by appointment only. To register for a Pre-Jordan Class, please call the Rectory during regular business Hours (Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm). Baptisms may be held on any Sunday once the Pre-Jordan Class is completed.

**Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation:** Anyone asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.

**Matrimony:** Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our annual Forty Hour Devotion will take place after the 10:30AM Mass on October 09, 2022, and will conclude on Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 7:00PM with evening prayer. Fr. John Weber, Pastor of Queen of the Universe in Levittown, PA, will be our homilist during this wonderful grace filled time for our parish.

Also, the Mass book for 2023 will open on Tuesday, October 25, 2022. More information about this will be forthcoming.

Today's Gospel from St. Luke talks about faith. Faith is not faith if kept in reserve for emergencies. Faith is lived daily and shapes the way we think and behave. It is about receptivity to God's presence in our daily lives. Our faith is a relationship with God who is real and who has revealed Himself completely in Jesus. We are called to, "Increase Our Faith!" Many of us, in our own frustration and despair, have shared the same central question: How long, O Lord? Today we are being challenged to stay faithful even when events force us to doubt God. Life can be very painful at times. Sometimes the pain is from the despair of human suffering. Sometimes the despair is from the demands of Jesus to "be perfect as my heavenly Father is perfect." In our reading from Habakkuk, Habakkuk tells us to believe in the vision of a just God and be patient. God will come. And St. Paul in our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, as he is awaiting his execution for living out the commands of Jesus, tells his most loved friend Timothy, "Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." We are obliged to go about our ordinary tasks in a responsible, devoted, and self-giving way. We are called to be obedient to God's commands. Jesus reminds us that as His followers, we are to be "faithful servants of God", and that we are to humbly submit if we want to grow in faith. Therefore, let us not despair. Don't let your present circumstances weaken your faith in God. Let us see ourselves as servants who do their duty, believing in God and keeping His ways, leaving despair behind.

Be assured of my prayers. I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.
