**Baptism:** Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism. These classes will take place at the Rectory by appointment only. To register for a Pre-Jordan Class, please call the Rectory during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm). Baptisms may be held on any Sunday once the Pre-Jordan Class is completed.

**Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation:** Anyone asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.

**Matrimony:** Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

**FUEL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

The cost of home heating will have a major impact on monthly budgets. To assist people with these rising costs, the **Pennsylvania Home Heating Fuel Assistance Rebate Program (LIHEAP)** is now in progress. This **Fuel Assistance Program** is available to people of all ages within the income guidelines. For example, **individuals** with a monthly income of **\$1,699 or less**, or a **two-person household** with a **monthly income of \$2,289 or less** can qualify for the grant. Call **United Social Services at 215-923-1900** Monday through Friday between 10AM and 4PM. A staff worker will explain the eligibility requirements, answer your questions and assist you in completing an application. **This grant is provided to all who qualify and does not have to be repaid.** All inquiries are **confidential**.



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Catholic Charities Appeal has begun in our Archdiocese. You should have received a direct mailing from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. If you haven't, there are pledge cards in the pews for you to make your pledge. Thank you for your generosity and continued support to Catholic Charities. Again, thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

On Saturday February 25, 2023, at 11:00AM Mass, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses the example of legalistic people to make His point; unless your behavior goes beyond that kind of superficial morality, you can't be My disciples. Jesus isn't demanding mere conformity to a set of laws; He's calling us to a deeper spirituality. Jesus shows how following Him makes a difference in the daily choices of His disciples. The Law of Moses is not abolished, but Jesus' followers who continue to follow it, cannot be satisfied with literal observance. For example, Jesus' disciples must avoid not only adultery but also lusting in their hearts. We all know people who can be warned over and over and over not to touch a stove's hot burner. Despite all these warnings, some people still choose to touch a hot burner and unfortunately, feel the pain of that decision.

One of the most amazing things about how we are made in the image and likeness of God is that we have free will. Indeed, our continuous gift of free will separates us from the rest of creation. With this gift comes great responsibility. You and I must choose if we will follow the law of Moses and the prophets, or will we follow the latest fashion and trend? Image what our lives will look like if we moved from keeping the commandments to living them.

St. Matthew shows us that the law has two levels. There is the surface level, "You have heard...", then there is the deeper interior level, "But I say to you...". It is not enough to pay attention to the surface level only. We are taught, for example, that anger often is the source for murder. Lust can easily lead to adultery. Non-violent resistance must replace our urge for retaliation. Committed relationships are sacred and thus marriage cannot be cavalierly dissolved by a mere bill of divorce. This is all about how we put the things we say we believe into practice. Christianity is not a theory or a philosophy. It is a way of life, and as such, it must be lived. Growing in the wisdom of God means turning away from this world's anxieties and cares, to fix our lives upon, "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit". Just as the Spirit has revealed these things to us, so also the Spirit will scrutinize us. The Spirit knows how we have come to make decisions throughout our lives.

Truth is not a *what* but a *who*: Jesus Christ. Even the smallest decisions we make each day help us to grow or not grow in our relationship with God and with each other. We must be willing to forgive. Righteous anger cannot be a permanent condition for those who follow Jesus, because forgiveness prepares us for worship. We need to grow in a relationship with God and with each other. Does Jesus make enough difference in our daily choices? We should ask ourselves, "Am I giving daily evidence that Jesus is the center of my life?"

God calls us to do more than what is acceptable to the world's standards. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be fully engaged in a deep and generous spirituality.

Be assured of my prayers and I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.
