Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our readings today are about being leaders in the community. To be a leader within a Christian community - and through Baptism we are called to leadership - we must first be true followers of Jesus. The command of Jesus to us was to carry on the work He had begun. He was the Good Shepherd who led and fed His sheep. It's clear that Jesus was pointing this out to Peter as the two men reconciled. Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" And Peter's response is, "Yes Lord, you know that I love you." Then Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." However, when Jesus asked the question of Peter, it is unclear to what "these" means. "These" could mean Peter's profession as a fisher man, his boats, his friends, etc. Jesus is asking Peter to love Him above everything and everyone. Once Peter puts Christ first and truly becomes His disciple, then he would be able to feed His lambs. Discipleship requires that we love Christ above everything and everyone. Being a shepherd to God's people is a direct consequence of loving Jesus. Though Peter is the rock, the head of the Church, this command to shepherd God's people is not just a command to popes and bishops. This command is to all of us who desire to be disciples.

Our Gospel provided a great contrast on how two individuals followed Jesus. The Beloved Disciple, though he officially remains anonymous in the Gospel itself, is always faithful to Jesus and always presented in a better light than Peter. This "Beloved Disciple" is closest to Jesus at the Last Supper. He is the only one who follows Jesus to the cross and is present as Jesus "hands over the spirit" to the new community of faith. It is this disciple who first believes when he sees the empty tomb and does not require seeing the risen Christ for faith.

Peter, on the other hand, follows only at a distance, bitterly denies his relationship with Jesus, and does not come to accept that Jesus has risen until he sees Jesus in the locked room. Much is made of this contrast, but what should be said is that Jesus loved them both and both were followers of Jesus until their deaths. What the Gospel gives us is the Beloved Disciple presented as the ideal disciple. Peter is given to us as we are - those who struggle with our discipleship.

What we see today is that Jesus' command to Peter to "Follow Me" is a command to all of us, and that Jesus will give us all that we need to do just that, even forgiveness when necessary. The question then for us is what are the "these" in our lives? What do we love more than Jesus? Do we love our comfort more than we love Jesus? Do we love our pleasures more or our success more than Jesus? Do we love what is politically correct more than Jesus who teaches us moral values? Do we love what the majority says is acceptable more than what Jesus says is truth? Do we love not being ridiculed for our stance on the values that Jesus teaches? Do we love our sense of freedom more than having to stretch out our hands and having someone lead us where we do not want to go? Are we willing to be disciples of Jesus? We are called to stay faithful to the name of Jesus. It has the power to save and redeem not only ourselves individually but the whole world as well. Perhaps we should note that in the Gospels, the Apostles never could accomplish anything without Jesus' help. If we want something more than we now know, we should decide what or whom we love more than anything or anyone else. Do you love Me more than these? We strive to be the beloved, but we can be at peace if we are only being Peter.

Be assured of my prayers, and I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.
