## rom the Pastor's Desk

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today is Holy Trinity Sunday. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit dwell at the core of all Christian Life. The Holy Trinity should not be seen as a theology problem but as a saving mystery to be lived. A mystery is something so close to us, something in which we are so bound up, that we actually become part of the question. Pope Paul VI called mystery “a reality imbued with the hidden presence of God.” Perhaps we should qualify “hidden”, for this truth is not something as Deuteronomy 30:11 says, “too mysterious or remote,” not “up in the sky” or “across the sea” so as to be inaccessible. “No, it is something very near to you... already in your hearts. “That’s a mystery, not a theological problem. Before we even think about the Trinity, we experience it in the mystery of lives touched by God’s creative, saving, and inspiring presence.

The Trinity addresses the fundamental question of “Who am I?” by saying that each of us is a recipient of God’s: 1) creative, generative love, 2) saving, redemptive forgiveness, and 3) inspirational, sustaining comfort.

1). Our God created the world and asked us to cherish/renew that creation. Scripture’s first verses attest to God’s creative power. We see that vital, creative force reenacted in our natural world every spring, and even every day. Every day is God’s recreation of a new day. Thousands of babies are born daily, but that common place event still strikes parents as a near-miraculous occurrence hinting at transcendence.

2). Our God came among us in the person of Jesus to save and heal. Scripture also tells us that the God whom the Hebrew people saw as the creator/sustainer of everything “pitched a tent” among us – came to us in human flesh to bring healing, mercy and redemption. Whenever we experience the life-giving power of forgiveness, we come in touch with the mystery of the God who saves. This savior is the very same creator who made us so that we could be called back to the source from which we came; creation presupposes salvation.

3). Our God lives among us as the Spirit of love, invigorating the Church and inspiring us to continue God’s work on earth. The Gospels end with Jesus promising that we will not be abandoned, but rather, supported by the Spirit of God until the end of time. Whenever we experience rebirth, when we are inspired to go out to the world with the message of God’s love, when we are “fired up” to evangelize, we are caught up in the mystery of God’s

invigorating spirit within us. This is the Spirit of God’s love, poured out in creation, poured out again in the blood of Jesus, and poured upon us in the water of Baptism.

May the love of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit continue to pour out in our hearts and be the center of our lives.

This weekend is Memorial Day Weekend. Memorial Day itself was a day set aside as a solemn day of mourning and remembrance to honor those who paid the ultimate price for our freedom. Therefore, we remember and honor all who have served our country.

Be assured of my prayers. I ask you to remember me in your prayers.

- \*Were baptized Catholic but have not yet received First Communion and/or Confirmation

### **CCD REGISTRATION FOR FALL 2021**



Registration for our Religious Education Program for the 2021-2022 school year is now open.

#### **The following is required for Registration:**

- 1) Students need to be 6 years or older by 09/01/21
- 2) Completed Registration Form and Fee
  - \*Registration fee of **\$175** per child for **Stella Maris Parishioners-\$75 deposit due by July 15, 2021**
  - \*Registration fee of **\$200** per child for **Non-Parishioners-\$100 deposit due by July 15, 2021**
- 3) Signed letter of permission from your pastor (only if you are not a member of Stella Maris Parish)
- 4) Baptismal certificate for all **new** registrations (only if your child was **not baptized** at Stella Maris)

### PROPERTY TAX REBATE

To help with the rising cost of living, you are reminded that **Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program** applications are now available. There are new guidelines which will permit individuals that **qualify to receive a rebate between \$250 and \$650 from property taxes or rent paid last year.** Funding for this rebate program is made possible by the Pennsylvania State Lottery Fund and is a rebate that does not have to be repaid. **This application must be filed by Wednesday, June 30, 2021.** To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a widow or widower 50 years of age or older, or a disabled person 18 years or older. Homeowners that have annual incomes of \$35,000 or less and renters with annual incomes of \$15,000 or less could qualify. **Only half of your annual Social Security or SSI income is counted toward the income guideline.** For more information or an application, call **United Social Services, Monday through Friday, between 10AM and 4PM at 215-923-1900** and a staff member will assist you.

### “YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH”

On the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 12/08/20, the Holy Father proclaimed the “Year of St. Joseph”, which extends to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on 12/08/2021. Pope Francis shares his beautiful reflections on St. Joseph in the new Apostolic Letter named, *With a Father’s Heart*. He shares his intent with the proclamation: **The aim of this Apostolic letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession, and to imitate his virtues and his zeal.”**

### Ways to Gain a Plenary Indulgence in the Year of St. Joseph

\*Meditate at least 30 minutes on the Lord’s Prayer, or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. \*Follow St. Joseph’s example by performing a spiritual or corporal work of mercy. \*Recite the Rosary with your family members and also among engaged couples. \*Entrust your daily activities to the protection of St. Joseph and invoke his intercession for those seeking work so they can find dignifying work to support themselves and their families. \*Recite the Litany to St. Joseph or any prayer to St. Joseph proper to liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all Christians suffering persecution. \*Recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph. \*This indulgence is also extended to the sick, the elderly, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their homes.
