Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Today we celebrate “*Corpus Christi*”, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Church, in her infinite wisdom, gives us this solemnity to remind us of the gift of Eucharist. We believe that we receive Christ, Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity under the appearance of ordinary bread and common wine.

There is truth in the old saying, “You are what you eat.” Sadly, our national epidemic of obesity makes that all too clear. But when applied to the spiritual food we eat and drink at the Eucharist, the adage takes on a new and more beautiful meaning. If we honestly believe that the Risen Christ becomes really present – body, blood, soul and divinity – under the outward sign of bread and wine, then when we eat this “heavenly food,” we are being fed on the Risen life of Christ.

If we really “are what we eat,” then it is more than a metaphor when we speak of ourselves, the Church, as the living Body of Christ.

When we receive Holy Communion, we also receive a mission. As one of the dismissal formulas in the Mass puts it: “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” Then others should encounter Christ in and through us. In other words, become what you have just eaten. Become another Christ for others.

Our faith teaches us that in the Eucharistic Species, after the words of consecration, the bread and wine cease to exist. The entire substance of the bread and wine instantaneously becomes the body and blood of Jesus; this is called transubstantiation.

In the fourth verse of the hymn, “Gift of Finest Wheat”, we are reminded of who it is we received in Eucharist; “The mystery of your presence Lord, no mortal tongue can tell: Whom all the world cannot contain comes in our hearts to dwell”.

Sometimes we can take this most sacred gift for granted. Let us never take the Body and Blood of Christ for granted. Let us always nurture and cherish this gift with our lives, remembering that the world cannot contain Him, yet He comes into our hearts to dwell. We should be willing to worship and protect Him at all costs. May the Body and Blood of our Lord continue to nourish us spiritually and physically, transforming our lives so that we may become another Christ for others.

Be assured of my prayers. I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.

CCD REGISTRATION FOR FALL 2021



Registration for our Religious Education Program for the 2021-2022 school year is now open.

The following is required for Registration:

- 1) Students need to be 6 years or older by 09/01/21
- 2) Completed Registration Form and Fee
 - *Registration fee of **\$175** per child for **Stella Maris Parishioners-\$75 deposit due by July 15, 2021**
 - *Registration fee of **\$200** per child for **Non-Parishioners-\$100 deposit due by July 15, 2021**
- 3) Signed letter of permission from your pastor (only if you are not a member of Stella Maris Parish)
- 4) Baptismal certificate for all **new** registrations (only if your child was **not baptized** at Stella Maris)

PROPERTY TAX REBATE

To help with the rising cost of living, you are reminded that **Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program** applications are now available. There are new guidelines which will permit individuals that **qualify to receive a rebate between \$250 and \$650 from property taxes or rent paid last year.** Funding for this rebate program is made possible by the Pennsylvania State Lottery Fund and is a rebate that does not have to be repaid. **This application must be filed by Wednesday, June 30, 2021.** To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a widow or widower 50 years of age or older, or a disabled person 18 years or older. Homeowners that have annual incomes of \$35,000 or less and renters with annual incomes of \$15,000 or less could qualify. **Only half of your annual Social Security or SSI income is counted toward the income guideline.** For more information or an application, call **United Social Services, Monday through Friday, between 10AM and 4PM at 215-923-1900** and a staff member will assist you.

“YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH”

On the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 12/08/20, the Holy Father proclaimed the “Year of St. Joseph”, which extends to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on 12/08/2021. Pope Francis shares his beautiful reflections on St. Joseph in the new Apostolic Letter named, *With a Father’s Heart*. He shares his intent with the proclamation: **The aim of this Apostolic letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession, and to imitate his virtues and his zeal.”**

Ways to Gain a Plenary Indulgence in the Year of St. Joseph

*Meditate at least 30 minutes on the Lord’s Prayer, or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. *Follow St. Joseph’s example by performing a spiritual or corporal work of mercy. *Recite the Rosary with your family members and also among engaged couples. *Entrust your daily activities to the protection of St. Joseph and invoke his intercession for those seeking work so they can find dignifying work to support themselves and their families. *Recite the Litany to St. Joseph or any prayer to St. Joseph proper to liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all Christians suffering persecution. *Recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph. *This indulgence is also extended to the sick, the elderly, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their homes.
