Bible Study: Bible Study is held in the classroom in the Church Vestibule every Saturday after the 8:00am Mass. (**Please note:** No Bible Study on Sodality Meeting Saturdays, and July and August.)

Baptism: Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism. These classes will take place at the Rectory by appointment only. To register for a Pre-Jordan Class, please call the Rectory during regular business Hours (Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm). Baptisms may be held on any Sunday once the Pre-Jordan Class is completed.

Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation: Anyone asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.


Matrimony: Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Each year, parishes in the Archdiocese participate in what is called the Missionary Cooperation Plan. Next weekend our parish will welcome Father Viktor Bohan CSsR, who will speak to us about the Polish Redemptorist-Mission in Russia.

The Polish Redemptorist-Mission in Russia has five pastoral centers in Russia, one in Kazakhstan, five in Belarus, and two in Ukraine. Unfortunately, between the COVID-19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine, times have been challenging. However, looking toward the future, the Redemptorists continue to stand for peace, working tirelessly to bridge the chasm created by the war. Currently 200 Ukrainian refugees found shelter in the Redemptorist communities and parishes in Poland. With our support, the Polish Redemptorists will be able to continue their missionary work. The second collection next weekend will be for this appeal. Thank you for your generosity.

In Luke's Gospel, Martha was doing the correct thing; she provided for her guests. Under normal circumstances, her great activity on behalf of Jesus would be laudable. But Martha was distracted. She was focused more on the details of hospitality than on the person who was the reason for the activity. We can also recognize the resentment that seemed to be growing within Martha due to Mary's lack of help. Resentment itself can be a distraction. Martha's distraction was that she was more worried about what Mary was doing rather than about the person to whom Mary was paying attention. In reality, both women were doing the right thing, Mary, who is sitting at Jesus' feet, is listening to the Word of God; she is a true disciple, (one who listens to God's Word). But Martha is doing right as well; she is a true disciple, (one who serves the Lord). It was not that what Martha was doing was wrong; it was that she had forgotten the One she was serving. When Martha offers a solution to her problem, "Tell Mary to help me", it seems like Jesus is reprimanding Martha for not choosing the better part like her sister Mary. However, this is not the main focus of this passage in the Gospel. The main thing is that both Mary and Martha are doing the same thing. They are both devoted to Jesus and so both are serving Jesus. Jesus did not criticize Martha for preparing a meal. If Martha was doing what she should have been doing, then what did she do wrong? Martha lost focus on why she was doing what she was doing. "Martha, you are anxious and worried." In other words, Martha was distracted. Her concern with Mary distracted her and therefore made her service a burden. This is what Jesus corrected and then taught: stay focused on why we do what we do. The "better part" was not sitting at Jesus' feet listening to His words. The "better part" was devotion to the Lord. The "better part" is finding our focus in Him for whatever we do. Jesus did not place one activity – listening or preparing a meal – above the other. Both are important to Jesus, for they are both expressions of our desire to love and serve. They are both aspects of discipleship. Are we focused on serving the Lord? How devoted are we?

Be assured of my prayers. I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.

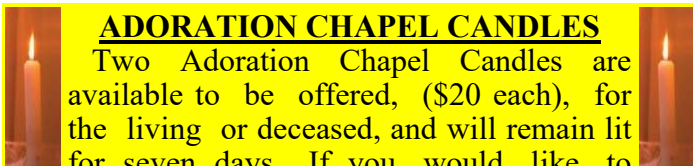
