**Baptism:** Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism. These classes will take place at the Rectory by appointment only. To register for a Pre-Jordan Class, please call the Rectory during regular business Hours (Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm). Baptisms may be held on any Sunday once the Pre-Jordan Class is completed.

**Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation:** Anyone asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.

**Matrimony:** Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

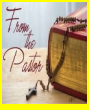

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Unfortunately, our culture does not reflect God. We live in a culture of wealth, control, and power. There is much to go around, and we are trained to “go get more.” This world, however, need not dictate who we are or to whom our ultimate trust belongs. It is vanity to put our trust in anything except God! Our readings today remind us that we should not be attached or wrapped up in something that takes us over, becomes our identity, and obscures our obligations to God and to others. In other words, we are not to let earthly things possess us, but that we should possess them. This is what happened in the parable of the ‘rich fool’ that Jesus told. The problem with this rich man was not wealth itself; it was his intention. If he had been acquiring wealth to share it, God’s judgment would have been different. But he amassed it to secure a cozy life of luxury; his huge cache turned out to be one guess: vanity. As Americans, we enjoy a natural constitutional right to private property. But this can be carried so far that it wrongly becomes a defense of pure greed: “It’s their money! If they want several \$40 million mansions and a fleet of \$20 million yachts, they have a perfect right to it.” Jesus would differ. Vehemently! Our wealth and possessions should always be used for God’s glory. Other things besides money require Christian balance: time, energy, talents, skills, and resources. These are also “possessions,” things about which it’s easy to be selfish. Balance, however, requires moderation. Devoting virtually every bit of those things to the service of others—while laudable in intention—can leave us emotionally and spiritually exhausted, and emaciated. Sincere gratitude for what we have makes us less likely to covet what we don’t. We need to respond to Jesus’ admonition that human life “does not consist of possessions.” We are much more than what we have, and what we have doesn’t even approach who we are in Christ Jesus. St Paul reminds us that we are already dead to the world but have risen with Christ. Putting God first is not about devaluing money and things. We are to see them as tools in our lives, not the point of our lives. Greed keeps us from being generous, and to be a Christian is to be generous. When we are greedy, we are choosing ourselves over God, and this is not a good choice. Like Qoheleth and Paul, Jesus warns His followers not to trust in material things instead of God. At Mass we celebrate God’s greatest gift: the saving passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus as a preparation for sharing in God’s eternal banquet. Who will be seated next to us? Won’t heaven finally be enough for us?

Be assured of my prayers and I ask you to please pray for me.

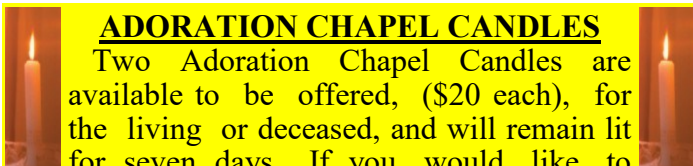
