Anointing of the Sick: In case of serious illness or advanced age, please call the Rectory to receive the Anointing of the Sick.

Baptism: Anyone who plans to have their child baptized is asked to call the Rectory to make arrangements. Parents are required by Canon Law to attend a Pre-Jordan Class prior to the Baptism.

These classes will take place at the Rectory by appointment only. To register for a Pre-Jordan Class, please call the Rectory during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 9am to 4pm). Baptisms may be held on any Sunday once the Pre-Jordan Class is completed.

Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation:

Anyone asked to be a Godparent/Sponsor should contact the Rectory regarding their Letter of Eligibility.

Matrimony: Couples must contact the priest at least six months prior to the intended wedding date. All couples are required to attend pre-marital instructions in preparation for marriage.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our annual Forty Hours Devotion will take place after the 10:30AM Mass on October 12, 2025, and will conclude on Tuesday, October 14, 2025, at 7:00PM with evening prayer.

Rev. John Masson, Director of Spiritual Formation at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, Ambler, PA, will be our homilist during this wonderful grace-filled time for our parish.

Also, the Mass book for 2026 will open on Wednesday, October 22, 2025. More information about this will be forthcoming.

Today's Gospel from St. Luke points out to us the sin of the rich man, and it is a terrible sin. In no way does the Lord condemn the man for being rich. The rich man is not mean or vile. He was simply living according to the customs of rich people then. Being wealthy was thought to be a blessing from God, an outward sign that God had favored a person. On the other hand, the poverty of the person like Lazarus was thought to be a curse from God. The assumption at the beginning of the parable would have been that the rich man would have been carried off by angels to the bosom of Abraham and that Lazarus would have been the one sent to the netherworld. Jesus radically reversed this expectation with this parable.

Jesus was not trying to tell people that poverty was good and being rich was evil. The sin Jesus pointed to is the fact that not only did the rich man not assist Lazarus, but the man also completely failed to notice him. Jesus reprimands the Pharisees for ignoring the needs of the poor. How are we doing in this regard? Could it be that we, too, are insulated from the sufferings of the poor? Jesus asserts that the wealthy who are indifferent to the poor in this life will be "in torment" in the hereafter, while the poor whom they ignored will be consoled. Even in death, the rich man saw Lazarus as nothing more than a servant. For God, failure to notice the suffering of a fellow human being is inexcusable and unacceptable. If we are to be Christ's followers, then we must be attentive to those who suffer and are in need. The challenge for all of us is to place ourselves before the Lord and before all the Lazarus' of our day. If we recognize that we have responsibilities to others, that is a good starting point for disciples of Jesus.

Be assured of my prayers. I ask you to please remember me in your prayers.

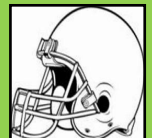

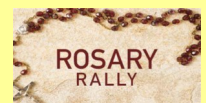
